I, Edwin Johnston, declare as follows:

- 1. I make this declaration in support of the Application for a Preliminary Injunction submitted by Plaintiffs The People of the State of California ex rel. Carol Spooner et al. I have personal knowledge of all of the facts contained in this declaration unless stated to be on information and belief. As to those statements alleged to be on information and belief, I believe them to be true. If called to testify, I would and could completely and truthfully testify as to the statements contained herein.
- 2. I have been a listener and supporter of radio station KPFT in Houston, Texas, since at least the early 1980s, when I used to do volunteer work on their program guide publication. I have met the KPFT radio station manager, Garland Ganter, many times since he was hired ten to twelve years ago. I have met Garland Ganter's wife, Molly O'Brien, on at least one occasion at a KPFT local board meeting within the past two years. I know and recognize and can identify both Garland Ganter and Molly O'Brien on sight.
- 3. The following is what happened on Friday evening, March 23, 2001, in front of KPFT, 419 Lovett Blvd. in the Montrose area of Houston, Texas.
- 4. I received word on Thursday, March 22, from Sheila Harris that there would be a protest outside KPFT on Friday evening since the station was sponsoring a backyard music event for their largest financial supporters. I arrived at KPFT just about 5pm on Friday, March 23, and met up with Sheila, her boyfriend Shannon Smith, Hep Ingham and his girlfriend. Hep provided us with flyers and posters from the trunk of his car. When I arrived I said, "I'm here!" Sheila said, "It's just us," meaning just she and Shannon, since Hep

and his girlfriend had to leave. I responded, "That's why I am here, to provide you some support."

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- We walked from the corner of Lovett Blvd., where Hep's car had been parked, towards KPFT. Sheila and Shannon planned to flyer the parked cars along Lovett Blvd. I planned to hold up posters and address the guests as they arrived at KPFT. was in front of KPFT I noticed some people in the parking lot and a woman sitting behind a table in the parking lot by the westernmost driveway that leads to the backyard where the musicians were setting up. I smiled at them and presented my protest posters exclaiming that now we were here. Molly O'Brien, a KPFT employee and wife of the station manager, Garland Ganter, addressed me from the table area, inviting me to come to the backyard for some free beer. I declined, saying "I'm not drinking and I have more important things to do, " referring to the protest. As various quests began arriving I informed them that it would be worthwhile for the sake of the community that they should stop giving money to KPFT. Some of these people expressed disagreement with that position, some expressed support, and others seemed indifferent.
- 6. After Sheila and Shannon finished leafleting the parked cars, they joined me in front of KPFT, handing out flyers to guests as they arrived and speaking with them about the issues surrounding the nationwide Pacifica protests. While we were standing out in front of KPFT, Shannon remarked that Garland Ganter was walking on the sidewalk towards us on his way to KPFT. I suggested that we ignore him, which we did. Ganter stopped by where we were standing and said to us, "It's not a party unless

the losers show up to protest." I rhetorically questioned him whether in fact we were losers. Then Ganter attempted to snatch a brochure from a batch that Sheila was holding, without even asking first. He was just going to grab one. I noticed this and said this was rude behavior on his part. Then Sheila graciously handed him one anyway since he seemed so interested in it. Ganter took a small glance at the brochure, made a dismissive comment about it and handed it back to her. Then he went to KPFT.

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- We continued to hold our protest much as we had been doing. While this was going on, another protester, Wendy Breunig, showed up. Our protest continued for a while longer. Wendy had brought her own set of different flyers to pass out. Everything was relatively normal until Molly O'Brien came out to harass us. O'Brien claimed that I was blocking the driveway, which I wasn't. No one was trying to get in or out of the parking lot and otherwise all the parking spaces there were completely full. told her that she had no authority to order us around and that if she had problems with what we were doing that she should call the police. She then tried the same tactic on Shannon, specifically, and Sheila and Wendy, less directly. So I said to them that since O'Brien's intimidation didn't work on me, she was going to try it Shannon agreed with this analysis, which seemed to out on them. greatly frustrate O'Brien. At this point I was holding at least one large foam core poster. Sheila and Wendy were holding bundles of flyers and Shannon was holding some flyers and perhaps another poster.
- 8. Sheila was handing out a flyer while O'Brien was near our group. Then O'Brien went berserk for some unknown reason.

She became livid and forcefully and violently yanked a large amount of flyers from Sheila's grasp, which totally surprised us Sheila, who is considerably smaller than O'Brien, all. was knocked off balance by the force of O'Brien's attack. I was so totally floored by this action on O'Brien's part that I began to yell "Assault, assault!" O'Brien then made her way towards KPFT. I decided to follow her and demand the flyers back, while still holding my poster. When O'Brien refused to return them, I faced her and reached to retrieve them. She then turned away from me still refusing to return them. I followed her again and faced her and attempted to reach for them a second time. When I did, she turned again and screamed "Rape!" in a very loud and hysterical manner. I kind of froze for a second then made a remark about how absurd all of her actions were.

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Then, without any warning and while still holding my poster, O'Brien's husband, Garland Ganter, ran at and forcefully shoved me, hitting me on my blind side, which caught me totally unawares. Ganter outweighs me by perhaps 100 pounds so this knocked me off balance and sent me several feet in the other direction. Once I recovered my balance I began shouting at Ganter for assaulting me. Then Ganter charged at me again, forcefully shoving me and grabbing hold of me. As I was trying to get out of his grip and while he was still holding me, I was hit on the left side of my body by another man I didn't know. This man then also held onto me, both of them struggling with me. Then it felt like yet one more person jumped on me. I was finally able to free myself by pushing one of the men away from me. Then I began yelling at Ganter again for assaulting me.

- 11. Soon a police car showed up and members of our group went to the window of the patrol car to express to a police officer that we had just been assaulted. Ganter came over and interrupted us saying that he was the one who had called them. I stated that, no matter who made the phone call, it was us who were assaulted by the KPFT group. Then Ganter asserted that he was the manager of the station as if that gave his false complaint more authority.
- asking all of us what happened. Ganter, Sheila and myself gave him our drivers licenses upon his request. Ganter stated his claims to Runnels somewhat. I said some things about what had happened as did Sheila and perhaps Shannon and Wendy. At one point O'Brien interrupted this and began yelling at Sheila and then Officer Runnels commanded her to step away. After hearing some initial comments from a variety of people, Officer Runnels took Ganter and O'Brien over onto the KPFT parking lot and talked at length with them while our group stood nearby where we had been protesting

- 13. There were at least three or four police cars on the scene with that many or more police present, including a sergeant who was present at our protest at KPFT last October in support of Amy Goodman of WBAI in New York City.
- 14. I was then driven by Officer Runnels to 61 Reisner St. and taken into the police station to be processed. I was eventually sent to the fifth floor homicide tank with a large group of other men. I spent several hours there, made some phone calls, and was later assigned a bunk for the evening to sleep. Sometime later my name was called and I was released on bond through the efforts of my girlfriend, Sheila, Shannon and Wendy.
- 15. Due to the assault I received several bruises and scrapes and much of my body was sore. Since I was still very sore on Monday morning, March 26, I called my chiropractor for an examination. At 3pm I saw him and was examined. The doctor noted the trauma I received and said that he would take copious notes and testify if needed in court.
 - 16. Also on Monday morning, Bessie Wash, the Executive

1	director of the Pacifica Foundation, interrupted regularly
2	scheduled programming on Pacifica stations nationwide to refer to
3	Friday evening's incident in Houston, accusing me of being violent
4	and jumping on O'Brien's back and knocking her to the ground.
5	Pacifica Foundation Board Chairman, David Acosta of Houston, also
6	interrupted regularly scheduled programming over Pacifica radio
7	stations nationwide to criticize "terrorists" who are physically
8	attacking staff and board members. Ms. Wash's comments were
9	rebroadcast for the evening news over Pacifica. And at WBAI in
LO	New York, I have been informed and believe that both Wash and
1	Ganter discussed the incident over the air. Later that night,
2	false and highly disparaging remarks about me were posted on the
.3	Pacifica Foundation website.
.4	17. I have consulted an attorney and I intend to sue the
.5	Pacifica Foundation, Bessie Wash, David Acosta, Garland Ganter,
6	and Molly O'Brien for defamation, libel and assault and battery.
7	I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the
8	State of California that the foregoing is true and correct.
